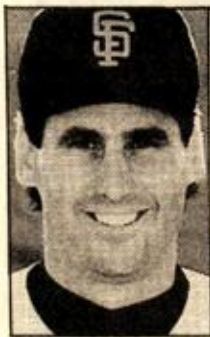


Black will undergo elbow surgery today

SAN FRANCISCO — Giants left-hander Bud Black will undergo surgery today to repair a tendon in his left elbow.

"They have a pretty good idea the tendon has pulled away from the bone," Black said Friday night before the game against the San Diego Padres. "I'm all for this. They told me it wasn't a radical procedure. I'll be ready for spring training."



Black Black, 36, posted an 8-2 record this season despite going on the disabled list three times.

Warren King.

Team physician Gordon Campbell said doctors weren't exactly sure what the injury was, but that it will be repaired once the elbow is opened up.

Black to Have Arm Surgery Today

After three stays on the disabled list and months of frustration, pitcher Bud Black will undergo surgery today to repair his left elbow. Black, who has one year left on his contract, said he should make a full recovery and be ready by spring training.

Although the Giants' medical staff will need to examine the elbow internally to determine the exact extent of the injury, Black had a good idea what was wrong: "The tendon has pulled away from the bone," he said.

"I'm all for it," Black, 36, said of the surgery. "The last two months have indicated that something needs to be done."

The surgery will be performed in Palo Alto by Dr. Warren King. Black (8-2) made just 16 starts and pitched 93%³/₄ innings this season, his lowest totals since 1988.
